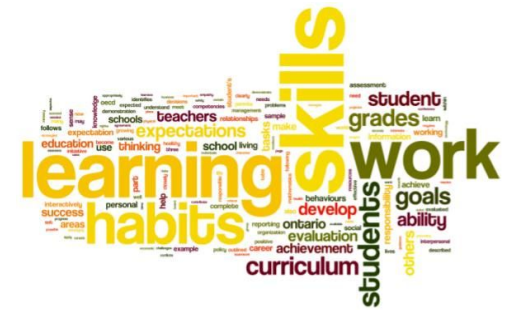


What are these things called “Learning Skills”?

<p style="text-align: center;">Responsibility</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • completes and submits work according to agreed-upon timelines • takes responsibility for and manages own behaviour 	<p style="text-align: center;">Organization</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • establishes priorities and manages time to complete tasks & achieve goals <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • gathers and uses information & resources to develop a plan to complete tasks 	<p style="text-align: center;">Independent Work</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • independently completes tasks and meet goals <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • uses class time appropriately • follows instructions with minimal supervision
<p style="text-align: center;">Collaboration</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • accepts various roles and a fair share of work in a group <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • responds positively to others • builds healthy peer-to-peer relationships and works with others to resolve conflicts • promotes critical thinking to solve problems and make decisions 	<p style="text-align: center;">Initiative</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • approaches new tasks with a positive attitude • demonstrates a willingness to take risks and interest in learning; • looks for and acts on new ideas and opportunities for learning <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • advocates for self and others 	<p style="text-align: center;">Self-Regulation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • sets own goals and monitors progress towards achieving them • seeks clarification or assistance when needed • assesses and reflects critically on own strengths, needs, and interests <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • perseveres when responding to challenge
